ICJ hears *The Jadhav Case (India v. Pakistan)* (decision expected by summer 2019)

The International Court of Justice (ICJ) in The Hague concluded hearings last week, and is considering for the first time ever whether an exception for consular access exists in the context of a *prima facie* case of espionage.

Khawar Qureshi QC acted for Pakistan, and is the only advocate ever to have acted for both India and Pakistan, as well as, on a matter between the two States. His cases for India include successfully achieving a settlement (of what was then the world's largest BIT claim for USD7billion) in the Dabhol matter in 2004, whilst still a Junior Counsel, for a fraction of less than 5% of the claim.
